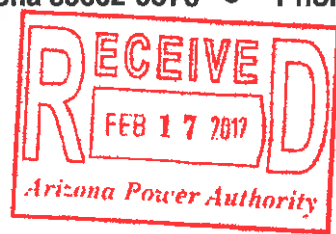



The City of Avondale would like to express an interest in applying for the purchase of Hoover Power. While we are still contemplating this possibility, we would like to provide you with the information requested on May 4, 2012.

Your first question relates to the rate classifications of interested parties. The City of Avondale does not sell energy and does not anticipate doing so in the future. Instead, we are interested in obtaining Hoover Power to operate both our drinking water system and our wastewater treatment system specifically for well pumping, water distribution, wastewater collection, wastewater treatment, and transportation of reclaimed water to our local underground storage facility.

Your second question relates to fair and reasonable allocation of Hoover Power in 2017. We respectfully submit the following suggestions:

- Please consider allocating some of the power to those who do not already have an allocation.
- Please consider uses other than those required for agricultural operations, specifically uses related to the operation of local water and wastewater systems.
- Please consider the needs of parties with relatively small energy requirements.

Response to May 4, 2012 Request for Information – Post-2017 Hoover Allocation Process

Dear Mr. Mulholland,

Thank you for the opportunity to participate in the post-2017 Hoover Power allocation process. The City of Chandler is interested in obtaining Schedule D power made available pursuant to the Hoover Power Allocation Act of 2011. As a municipality that owns and operates potable water and wastewater utilities, we are a relatively large power user, but not a traditional recipient of Hoover Power. Therefore, most of the questions on the circa 1985 Hoover Power application are not relevant to Chandler's operations.

In calendar year 2011 municipal operations in Chandler used in excess of 109,000 MWh of electricity. This is after an investment grade energy audit, many equipment upgrades and an ongoing water system optimization program. Due to several major employers moving their operations to Chandler we anticipate increased municipal power demands and wish to ensure a dedicated stable power supply that includes Hoover power.

I look forward to continued participation in the Post 2017 Hoover power allocation process.

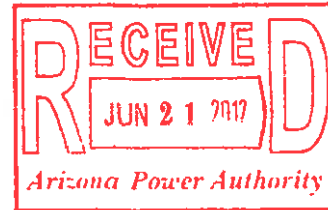

Dear Mr. Mulholland:

The City of Phoenix (Phoenix) is responding to a May 4, 2012, request for information issued by the Arizona Power Authority (APA), as subsequently modified on May 7 and May 16, 2012. We understand that the APA is collecting specific information regarding power use by potential interested parties, as well as gathering general suggestions on how Hoover power should be allocated in 2017.

With regard to specific power uses, Phoenix is currently considering the use of Hoover power primarily for its municipal water and wastewater utility. Phoenix is an incorporated city that operates a public water utility serving an estimated 1.455 million persons in its service area. The Phoenix service area represents about 39 percent of Maricopa County's population and 23 percent of the total population of Arizona. The incorporated area of Phoenix covers 546 square miles.

Phoenix is interested in exploring the possibility of entering into a contract for the purchase of Hoover power when new contracts are made available in 2017, and believes that it is eligible to do so because it meets the State definition of "qualified purchaser" under A.R.S. § 30-101 and the state definition of a "public utility" under A.R.S. § 45-1702. The sale of Hoover power is subject to the Federal preference originally established in the Reclamation Act of 1906, and as modified by the Reclamation Project Act of 1939 states that: "preference shall be given to municipalities and other public corporations or agencies" among others (43 U.S.C. § 485h(c)).

Accordingly, Phoenix requests that it be included in the Hoover marketing process as an "interested party" and that it receive all necessary applications and forms at the appropriate time.

Phoenix is planning for the use of Hoover power at facilities associated with its water and wastewater utility, although the City does have other significant power loads. Phoenix would be an end user of the power and would not sell or re-market it to others. Specific water and wastewater facility power loads and costs are shown in the following chart:

Dear Mr. Mulholland:

The Metropolitan Domestic Water Improvement District (District) is a public water utility serving 55,000 people in the Tucson metropolitan area. We are the second largest public water provider in eastern Pima County. The District was established by the Pima County Board of Supervisors on October 1992 as a water improvement district. The District is governed by a publicly elected Board of Directors.

The District has been attending the Arizona Power Authority (APA) meetings over the last year to learn more about Hoover Power contracts. It is our understanding that if the U.S. Congress approves legislation on post-2017 power and energy at Hoover Dam that the APA will be the entity in Arizona approving new contractors. The District is interested in exploring the advisability of entering into a contract for the purchase of Hoover power, and believes that it is eligible to do so because it meets the State definition of "district" under A.R.S. § 45-2502. As we enter into this process, we would appreciate your apprising us of any reasons why the District might not be eligible to do so, if you know of any, because we are likely to invest substantial resources as we undertake the application process.

The District also understands that any applicant would need a Power Purchase Certificate from APA. Assuming that the District meets the statutory definition of a "district", it would be helpful to know what APA's process is and any contracts required from an applicant for obtaining a Power Purchase Certificate. We look forward to working with you to identify the most appropriate ways to engage in this process.

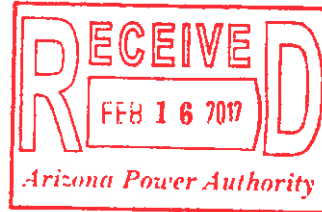

The Town of Fredonia, Arizona (Town) hereby makes its formal request, through its consultant, Mr. Richard L. Darnall, of Utility Resource Services, Inc. (URS), to be included in the allocation process and that the Arizona Power Authority (APA) provide all written memoranda with regard to the application for post 2017 Hoover Power and that the Town be included on any and all notices, agenda and special meetings to be conducted by the APA. If this information can be obtained at the APA's web site please provide the access information.

The Town owns and operates its own 69kV/12.5kV electric distribution system and receives an allocation of Western Area Power Administration's (Western) Parker-Davis Power (P-DP). The Town also has in place transmission agreements with Western and Garkane Power Association for the delivery of P-DP to the Town. Additionally, the Town is situated in the consolidated Hoover and Parker-Davis marketing area and within the State of Arizona.

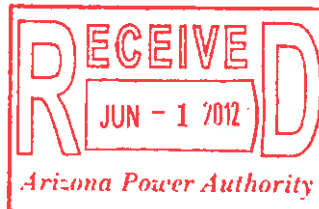
