NOTE: *This is not an official notice to receive applications for the purchase of Hoover power. Section R12-14-201 of the Administrative Code of the Arizona Power Authority provides for the Arizona Power Authority to provide a preliminary proposal for the allocation and marketing of available long-term Hoover power. This memorandum is not an official notice and should not be construed as such.*

PURPOSE: To clarify that the "Request for Information" emailed to all Interested Parties on Friday, May 4, 2012, was not a mandatory request for information which must be answered in order for an interested party to maintain continued consideration for an allocation of Hoover power in 2017.

At the May 15, 2012 Arizona Power Authority Commission meeting, Vice-Chairman Stephen Brophy requested that the Power Authority staff send an email to all parties interested in the Post-2017 allocation of Hoover power notifying them that the "Request for Information" dated May 4, 2012 for preliminary development of information was not a mandatory request for information. Should any party choose not respond to this Request for Information, that party will continue to be considered as an "Interested Party" by the Arizona Power Authority for further data requests, analysis, and allocation of Hoover power. We would hope that all parties respond as this will assist the Power Authority staff in developing meaningful and reasonable data requests, which will form the basis for fairly allocating Hoover power in 2017. Information provided will be very helpful, and continued cooperation between the Power Authority and interested parties results in the best atmosphere for working together to find a fair and reasonable basis for allocating the Hoover power in 2017.
